



Newfoundland-based housing security coordinator hosts community conversation on climate change, income security

NEWFOUNDLAND: Dan Meades, provincial coordinator of the Transition House Association of Newfoundland and Labrador, has completed a series of community conversations on the links between climate change, income security and community resilience in Newfoundland and Labrador.

Organized in partnership with the Green Resilience Project, the conversation aimed to identify and document a wide range of perspectives on what community members need to build resilience and encourage local action on all the aspects of the climate crisis.

Climate change and income insecurity are two of the most urgent challenges facing Atlantic residents. The conversation brought community members together to discuss the connections between these issues, brainstorm solutions and identify what they need to put them into action.

Details from the conversation will be shared in the Green Resilience Project's final report, to be published in April 2022.
